

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING PAPERWORK (Immigration):

- Complete the General Patient Registration and Consent form on the front and sign on the back
 - Complete the Health History Form (Answer all questions on top half of page only, and then sign/date above “examinee signature”)
 - Complete the following on the I-693 Forms (BLACK INK, CAPITAL LETTERS)
 - Page 1: Complete the entire page
 - Page 2: Complete name at top of the page and complete contact information only.
DO NOT SIGN Page 2.
- Pages 3-14: Complete Name portion only at the top of each page.

Per USCIS, I-693 forms are to be printed one page per sheet; NO FRONT AND BACK

Items to bring with you to your appointment:

- Completed paperwork
- Photo ID (can be passport, driver’s license, work authorization card, etc.)
- All vaccination (immunization) records for patient from healthcare providers in or out of USA
- Interpreter (required if patient does not speak or read English). This **CAN** be a friend or family member.

Payment Notice

This is to inform you that Redpoint Medical, PSC does not participate in or accept reimbursement from any insurance company for Immigration Exams. Services related to Immigration Exams are a requirement of the Federal Government. If a medical condition is discovered during the Immigration Exam, Redpoint Medical, PSC does not automatically provide continuity of care services and you may be referred for or may independently seek evaluation and treatment for such condition outside the scope of this agreement. All immigration services are considered your financial responsibility, in total, and must be paid in full before release of the Form I-693 form and immunization record.

We are not always able to determine the exact cost of your services before your visit. The complexity of your visit, as well as any testing or treatment required, will determine your total fee for the Immigration Exam. At the time of service, you will be required to pay the exam fee (this covers the exam, and if needed, TB blood test, other required blood and/or urine testing, and the completion of applicable paperwork). All additional charges incurred, including but not limited to the cost of immunizations and ancillary services (e.g. additional lab tests and x-rays) will be payable prior to the release of the Form I-693 and/or immunization forms. Additionally, USCIS also requires that the civil surgeon (physician) who performs the exam also treat any individual who tests positive for syphilis and/or gonorrhea. The charges for these treatments and services are not included in the standard immigration exam fee and will be additional. Medications required for the treatment of these conditions, however, may be covered by your health insurance at participating pharmacies.
